State health departments around the country use Animal Control to help protect the public from exposure to rabies disease. Las Cruces Animal Control would like to remind people their cats and dogs must remain current on rabies vaccinations. In fact, a lot of animal control agencies operate under the Health Department for that reason. The city of Las Cruces Animal Control operates under the Las Cruces Police Department.

All dogs and cats must have a City Pet License. Cats and dogs are required to be confined appropriately to the pet owner's property unless while off property, they are properly caged or crated or controlled by a leash or lead that is no longer than eight feet.
